The issue of land expropriation without compensation has been in the public domain in South Africa for some time and it has caused confusion on how it will work. The President of South Africa Cyril Ramaphosa explained on the 23 August 2018 in parliament on how it will work.

Land expropriation will involve mainly releasing land that is owned by Local Government, State Owned Enterprises, Provincial Government, and National Government. This land will be given to people who don't have land in mainly urban areas. Privately owned land that is not being used will also be identified and a mechanism will be put in place to acquire the land.

Land that is privately owned like game farms, lodges, and other tourism related attraction is **not** identified to be expropriated. There are no plans immediately or long term to expropriate such land. There also no plans to take privately owned land as the constitution and other laws of the land doesn't not allow.

All the guest that are coming from various international countries for any tourism related activities are welcomed in South Africa, and all activities including hunting will continue as normal
