

Method 10

Spread

Tip to tip

For European and Asian Wild Cattle

Rank on the spread (X–Y).

- 1. Measure the length of each horn from the lowest point in front to the tip (A–B). Sheep horns are longitudinally ridged; begin the measurement in the front of the horn (approximately above the eye), where the ridge meets the skull, and follow the ridge throughout the curve of the horn to the tip.
- 2. Measure the circumference of each horn at the base (C), the first quarter (D), the second quarter (E) and the third quarter (F). These measurements are to be made at right angles to the axis of the horn.
- 3. Measure the greatest outside spread (X–Y).
- 4. Measure the spread, tip to tip (B–G).

[In the future we will look to rank the entries using the sum of the spread and the bosses of each horn.]
